## Starting point

- COP 20 in Lima, Dec. 2014, requested the ADP to present a negotiating text before May 2015
- ADP Geneva meeting : the first of 4 meetings in preparation for the Paris COP (+ informal meetings of negotiators in April \& May, and informal ministerial meetings in March and May)
- The ADP based its work on the elements annexed to Decision 1/ CP. 20 (Lima Call for Climate Action)


## Text developped in Geneva

Draft text developed in Geneva :

- From 39 to 88 pages : need to be streamlined first
- This text is the basis to start negotiations in June, followed by other ADP meetings in August \& October in Bonn (towards the Paris agreement).
- covers all key substantive areas : mitigation, adaptation, finance, technology, capacity building, transparency ...
- reflects sharp differences in Parties' positions


## Main negotiating points in the text of Paris agreement (1)

Mitigation remains a critical concern on the road to Paris

- assessment of Parties' contributions and the time frames for the submission of new commitments (cycles of 5,10 years)
- Review (ex ante and/or ex post) of Parties' mitigation commitments or contributions, with or without differentiation between developed and developed countries, ...
- Review of Parties' compliance with their mitigation commitments (Compliance Committee, International Climate Justice Tribunal)


## Main negotiating points in the text of Paris agreement (2)

- question of differentiation and "Common But Differentiated Responsibility and Respective Capabilities" (CBDRRC)
- the issue of finance (wide range of options )
- greater prominence to adaptation
- issue of loss and damage $\&$ human rights protection
